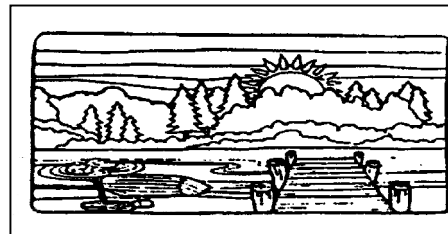

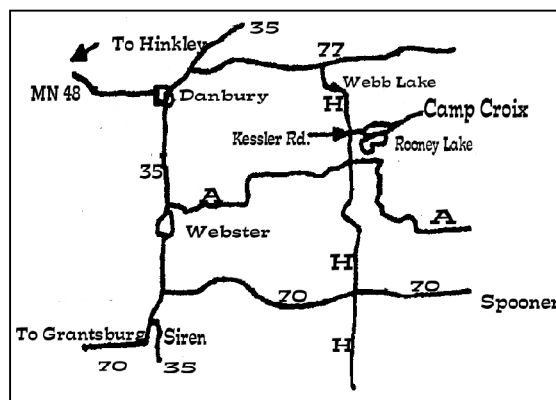

Location: Two easy-to-travel routes will bring you through some of Wisconsin's finest vacationland to Camp Croix.

1. From the Twin Cities area take I35 north to Minnesota 48. Then east for approximately 30 miles to Danbury, Wisconsin. Take Wisconsin 77 east approximately 12 miles to Wisconsin H. Next drive south about 5.8 miles to "Kessler Road". Turn east and travel about 1/2 mile to "Gold Star Road" which takes you to CAMP CROIX.

2. Take U.S. 61 and U.S. 8 to St. Croix Falls, Wisconsin. Drive east 4 miles and turn north on Wisconsin 35. Drive north 33 miles to Webster, Wisconsin. Drive 1/2 mile north to County A. Then drive east for about 17 miles to County H. Drive north about 2 miles on County H to "Kessler Road". Turn right and travel about 1/2 mile to "Gold Star Road", which takes you to CAMP CROIX.
